The board approved building permits 2009 – 990 thru 1059, 69 permits representing \$706,799.00 of investment in the community. 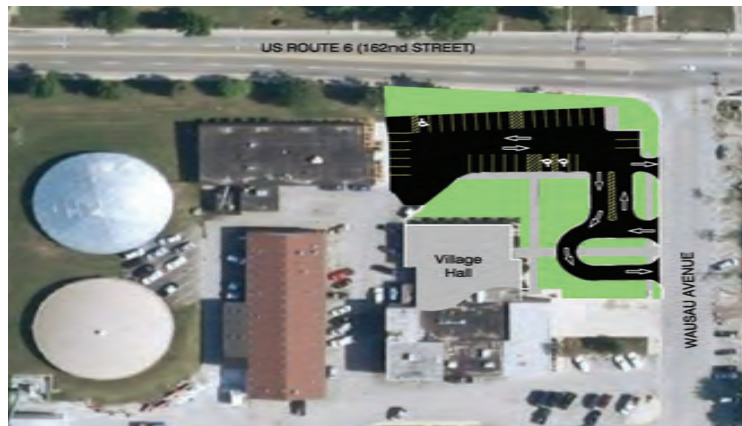

## Municipal Campus Parking Lot Improvements on the Way!



Tied to the planned “push-thru” of Wausau Avenue is the improvement of the municipal campus parking lot, which ultimately will improve public safety in and around this area, as well as enhance the village’s customer service efforts. The upgrades planned for the parking lot are resurfacing of the existing lot, construction of a new circle driveway, and adding a customer-friendly bill payment drop-box for motorists. The project is scheduled to begin this week, and weather permitting, the majority of the work will be complete by Thanksgiving.

## Public Works

Trustee James announced that the Public Works Department is expected to take possession of a new Sewer Jet Vector 2110 truck this week. The Vector 2110 will be used to clean sewer mains, remove tree roots, open blocked mains, remove material from structures via vacuum and hydro-excavate below grade work sites. This new unit enables Public Works to accomplish those tasks more efficiently and with much less disturbance to landscaping and roadways.

## Parks & Recreation

Trustee Johnson encouraged residents to register for the second session of fall programs offered at the Community Center. The schedule of classes is available online at [www.southholland.org](http://www.southholland.org), and program books can be reviewed at the Community Center.
