Flood Awareness Week

March 15 - 19, 2010 is National Flood Safety Awareness Week, and it is intended to highlight some of the many ways floods can occur, the hazards associated with floods, and what you can do to save life and property.



The Village of South Holland, in partnership with the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD), will host an Open House at the Community Center, Tuesday, March 16 from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. This is an opportunity for residents to receive important information about flooding.

A representative from MWRD will present an overview of the Thornton Transitional Reservoir and the Deep Tunnel Project and its impact on the area.

Additionally, MWRD will explain the rain barrel recycling initiative, and local business owner Dale Ter Haar of the South Holland True Value Hardware store will discuss what residents need to know about "cleaning up" after a flood.

Finance

Trustee Sullivan moved for the approval of finance registers #680 and #681 in the amount of \$445,926.31 and \$422,578.42, respectively. The board approved these registers, which cover day-to-day operations, vendor payments and salaries.
